YEAR I SEMESTER I

MB 101 INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION (2033)

This course will focus on subjects such as essential concepts of teaching; aims and functions of education, the relationship of education with other fields and sciences; legal, social, cultural, historical, political, economic, psychological and philosophical aspects of education; research methods in education; school and classroom as an educational and learning environment; current developments in the teaching profession and teacher training; educational trends in the twenty-first century.

MB 102 EDUCATIONAL SOCIOLOGY (2033)

Basic concepts of sociology: Society, social structure, social phenomenon, social event, etc.; the pioneers of sociology (İbn-i Haldun, A. Comte, K. Marx, E. Durkheim, M. Weber, etc.) and their views about education; education from the perspectives of basic sociological theories (functionalism, structuralism, symbolic interactionism, conflict theory, phenomenology and ethnomethodology); social processes and education (socialization, social stratification, social mobility, social change, etc.); social institutions and education (family, religion, economy, politics); the development of sociology and educational sociology in Turkey (Ziya Gökalp, İsmail Hakkı Baltacıoğlu, Nurettin Topçu, Mümtaz Turhan, etc.); culture and education; school as a social, cultural, moral system and community.

GK 101 ATATÜRK'S PRINCIPLES AND HISTORY OF TURKISH REVOLUTION I (2033)

Internal and external reasons that prepared the collapse of the Ottoman State; innovation movements in the Ottoman State in the 19th century; streams of thoughts in the last period of the Ottoman State; the political and military state of the Ottoman State in early 20th century; World War I and the issue of Armenia; the invasion of Anatolia and reactions; Mustafa Kemal Pasha's going to Samsun and his activities; the period of congresses and organization; the opening of the last Ottoman Parliament and the acceptance of the National Pact; Preparation for the War of Independence and material and spiritual foundations of this preparation; the opening of the Turkish Grand National Assembly and its activities; the Treaty of Sevr; struggles in the South and East fronts; the establishment of the regular army, the Greek attack and the wars in the West front, the signing of the Mudanya Truce, the meeting of the Lausanne Conference and the signing of the Peace Treaty.

GK 103 FOREIGN LANGUAGE I (2033)

The present progressive tense; the simple present tense; oral, reading, writing and listening skills with these tenses; oral skills (introducing oneself, being able to describe something, giving directions, question and answer patterns for personal information); reading skills (reading lists/price tags and asking questions in a restaurant, in transportation such as on a bus or train); writing skills (writing a short message, writing the content of a poster, filling in forms); listening skills (giving directions, describing a place or a person, etc.).

GK 105 TURKISH LANGUAGE I (3055)

The written language and its features; spelling and punctuation; the features of written and oral expression; writing a paragraph and types of paragraphs (introductory paragraph, developmental paragraph and concluding paragraph); ways of developing written expression (exposition, argumentation, narration, description, definition, exemplification, comparison); the structure of a text (structural features of a text, the parts of introduction, development and conclusion); the features of textuality (cohesion, coherence, intentionality, acceptability, situationality, informativity, intertextuality); writing a text (drafting, writing, editing and sharing); writing an informative-expository text, writing a narrative text, writing a descriptive text; writing an argumentative text.

GK 107 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGIES (3055)

Information technologies and computational thinking; problem solving concepts and approaches; algorithms and flow charts; computer systems; basic concepts about software and hardware; the foundations of operating systems, current operating systems; file management; auxiliary software; word processing softwares; computation/table/graphic softwares; presentation softwares; desktop broadcasting; database management softwares; web design; use of internet in education; communication and cooperation technologies; use of secure internet; information ethics and copyrights; the effects of computer and internet on children/adolescents.

RPD 101 INTRODUCTION TO PSYCHOLOGY (2044)

Definition of psychology, history of psychology, fields of psychology (social psychology, clinical psychology, educational psychology, etc.); theories of psychology (behavioral theories, cognitive theories, existential theory, etc.); biological foundations of psychology, intelligence and theories, sensation and perception, memory; personality and theories, abnormal behaviors, motivation, excitement, defense mechanisms.

RPD 103 CULTURAL ANTHROPOLOGY (2044)

Basic subjects of anthropology and the concept of culture; history of cultural anthropology and cultural change, culture and values, concepts related to culture (language, ecology, modes of production and economy), gender, marriage, family, kinship and lineage systems; symbolic meaning of social organizations and ceremonies; anthropology of religion, communication, economics, education, film and photography, history, journalism, law, linguistics, literature, medicine, political science and sociology within the scope of the course and within the framework of counseling.

YEAR I SEMESTER II

MB 103 EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY (2033)

Basic topics and problem areas of philosophy; ontology, epistemology, philosophy of ethics and education; basic philosophical trends (idealism, realism, naturalism, empiricism, rationalism, pragmatism, existentialism and analytical philosophy) and education; educational philosophy and educational trends: perennialism, essentialism, progressivism, existentialist education, critical/radical education; educational views of some philosophers in İslam and the West (Platon, Aristoteles, Socrates, J. Dewey, İbn-i Sina, Farabi, J. J. Rousseau etc.); the nature of human nature, individual differences and education; education from the viewpoint of some political and economic ideologies; movements of thought dominant in modernization in Turkey and education; philosophical foundations of Turkish education system.

MB 204 INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGIES (2033)

Information technology in education; classification of instruction process and instructional techniques; theoretical approaches to instructional technologies; new trends in learning approaches; current literacy; instructional techniques as tools and materials; design of instructional materials; designing thematic instructional materials; creating subject-specific object repository, instructional material evaluation criteria.

GK 102 ATATÜRK'S PRINCIPLES AND HISTORY OF REVOLUTION II (2033)

Revolutions made in the political field (Abolition of Sultanate, proclamation of the Republic, Abolition of the Caliphate); revolutions made in the social field (hat revolution, closure of İslamic Monasteries and Zawiyahs, Law of Calendar, Clock and Surname); revolutions made in the field of education and culture (the Law of unification of education, the alphabet revolution, revolution of Turkish History and Language); revolutions made in the field of law; attempts to transition to multi-party during Atatürk's time and reactions (establishment closure of the Progressive Republican Party, the Sheikh Said Revolt and assassination attempt on Atatürk); attempts to transition to multiparty during Atatürk's time (establishment and closure of the Free Republican Party and the Menemen incident); Turkish economic resources and politics in the period of the Republic (the İzmir Economy Congress); the Turkish foreign policy in Atatürk's time (the Exchange of population, membership to the League of Nations, the Balkan Entente and the Sadabat Pact); the Turkish foreign policy in Atatürk's time (The Montreux Convention, the Annexation of Hatay to the Homeland, Turkey's bilateral relationships with other nations); definition of Atatürkist thought system and Atatürk's principles; Turkey after Atatürk, the Democrat Party's years of power, Turkey in 1960s and 1970s, the Turkish foreign policy after 1960.

GK 104 FOREIGN LANGUAGE II (2033)

Simple past tense; future tense; modals (can, could, may, might); speaking, reading, writing and listening skills with these tenses and modals; oral skills (asking and answering questions in restaurants and ordering a meal, etc.) reading skills (internet weather forecast reports, recipe and various texts); writing skills (writing a short message, giving written directions, writing an email/invitation, etc.) listening skills (weather forecast report, recipe, etc.).

GK 106 TURKISH LANGUAGE II (3055)

Features of academic writing; benefiting from definitions, concepts and terms in academic writings; objective and subjective expression; structures of and types of academic texts (articles, reports and scientific abstracts, etc.); writing a claim, proposition (verifying, defending and objecting to an idea); formal features of scientific reports and articles; steps of writing a report; exposition, argumentation, establishment of intertextual relationships, citation (referencing and footnotes, making a list of references); writing a title, summarizing, writing a key word; ethical principals in scientific writings; practices of writing academic texts.

RPD 102 DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY I (2044)

Basic concepts and principles related to development, factors affecting development: hereditary factors, environmental factors, historical time factor; developmental theories: Freud's psycho-sexual development theory, Erikson's psycho-social development theory, Piaget's cognitive development theory, Maslow's personality development theory, Levinson's development theory, ecological approach (Bronfenbrenner); prenatal development, physical development in childhood, cognitive development, personality development, moral development; Physical development in adolescence, developmental tasks specific to adolescence, cognitive development in adolescence, personality development, moral development and psycho-social development.

RPD 104 PHYSIOLOGICAL PSYCHOLOGY (2044)

Field and research methods of physiological psychology; physiology and anatomy of the organism, behavioral mechanisms, sensory functions, motor functions and emotions, motivation and physiological basis of motivation, functional disorders and the causes of these disorders.

RPD 106 SCHOOL GUIDANCE AND PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING (2055)

Basic concepts and principles of RPD, history, field and branches of RPD; research and evaluation methods used, psychological counseling process, counseling theories, school counseling models (traditional and developmental), school counseling approaches (crisis-oriented, curative-remedial, preventive and developmental), the purpose and principles of the traditional school counseling model, the traditional school role and functions of the psychological counselor, the purpose of the developmental school counseling model principles and program (Comprehensive Developmental Guidance Programme), basic services/interventions, and the role and functions of the developmental school counselor; Purpose and principles of developmental and preventive approach in RPD, importance of life skills training in developmental approach, positive youth development approaches and prevention levels in preventive approach (basic, second and third level).

YEAR II SEMESTER III

MB 203 TEACHING PRINCIPLES AND METHODS (2033)

Basic concepts about teaching principles and methods; principles, models, strategies, methods and techniques of teaching-learning; setting goals and objectives in teaching; content selection and arrangement in teaching and learning; teaching materials; planning of teaching and teaching plans; theories and approaches about teaching; teaching in effective school, learning and achievement in learning; evaluation of classroom learning.

RPD 201 DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY II (2044)

Transition to adulthood (emerging adulthood); basic characteristics of young adulthood, developmental tasks specific to young adulthood, establishing close relationships in young adulthood, adaptation to working life in young adulthood; basic features of middle adulthood, developmental tasks specific to middle adulthood and problems that may be encountered, physical development in middle adulthood, cognitive development in middle adulthood, personality development in middle adulthood, psycho-social development in middle adulthood; Basic features of old age, developmental tasks specific to old age, physical development in old age, personality development in old age, cognitive development in old age and psycho-social development in old age.

RPD 203 PSYCHOLOGY OF LEARNING (2044)

Basic concepts and principles related to learning, factors affecting learning (learner, learning material, learning strategy, learning environment), learning theories (behavioral approach, cognitive approach, humanistic approach), effective learning methods and techniques.

RPD 205 SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY (2044)

Social psychology field and research methods; social perception and social cognition, attitudes and theoretical approaches to attitude change; psychological processes affecting social behavior, social influence and conformity, group dynamics, interpersonal relationships.

RPD 207 BASIC STATISTICS (2044)

Basic concepts of statistics, data organization, descriptive statistics, probability calculations, probability distributions, parametric and nonparametric hypothesis tests, correlation and its types, simple linear and multiple regression analysis, t tests, analysis of variance and application of these statistics in package programs.

YEAR II SEMESTER IV

MB 202 HISTORY OF TURKISH EDUCATION (2033)

Subject, method and sources of the history of Turkish education; education in early Turkish states; education in early Muslim Turkish states; education in the Turkish Seljuks and Anatolian Principalities; education in the Ottoman State: education system until the early innovation movements; education in Turkish states outside the geography of the Ottoman in the 13-18th centuries; innovation movements in education until the Reform Era in the Ottoman State; establishment of modern education system from the Reform Era to the Republic; reorganization of traditional education; education in the other Turkish states and communities in Eurasia in the 19-20th centuries; education during the War of Independence; education in the Turkish

Republic: foundations, structure, establishment and development of the Turkish education system; the process of teacher training from the past to the present; education in the Turkic World in the 21st century; common goals, language and alphabet unity, joint history writing efforts.

MB 201 RESEARCH METHODS IN EDUCATION (2033)

Basic concepts and principles about research methods; the process of research (noticing the problem, determining the problem and sample, data collection and analysis, interpreting results); general features of data collection instruments; analysis and evaluation of the data; access to articles, dissertations and databases; research models and types; basic paradigms in scientific research; quantitative and qualitative research designs; samples, data collection and data analysis in qualitative research; validity and reliability in qualitative research; study, evaluation and presentation of articles or dissertations; preparing a research report in line with research principles and ethics; action research in education.

GK 202 COMMUNITY SERVICE PRACTICES (1233)

Concepts of society, community service practices and social responsibility; social responsibility projects from the perspectives of social and cultural values; determining current social problems; preparing projects for the solution of social problems determined; being involved voluntarily in social responsibility projects individually and as a group; participating in social responsibility projects in various institutions and organizations; participating as an audience, speaker or organizer in scientific events such as panels, conferences, congresses, symposiums; evaluating the results of social responsibility projects.

RPD 202 THEORIES OF PERSONALITY (2022)

Basic concepts of personality, development of personality, harmony and mental health; characteristics and comparison of personality theories, associating personality theories with field applications.

RPD 204 LIFE PERIODS AND ADAPTATION PROBLEMS (2022)

Considering the concepts of normality and abnormality from different perspectives, diagnostic systems and criteria for adjustment disorder in diagnostic systems, differential diagnosis criteria for diagnosing adjustment disorders (post-traumatic stress disorder, oppositional defiant disorder, different aspects from conduct disorders), reasons for considering adjustment disorders according to age periods. , protective factors and risk factors in adjustment disorders; first childhood, second childhood, adolescence, young adulthood, adulthood, old age adjustment disorders and coping with them.

RPD 206 CHARACTER AND VALUES EDUCATION (2033)

Conceptual framework: Character, personality/personality, value, virtue, morality, temperament, etc.; character development and education; family, environment and school in character development and education; definition and classification of values; the sources of

values and their individual, social, cultural, religious, moral foundations; character and value education approaches and practices; intercultural differentiation and culture of living together in character and value education; character and value education in terms of educational philosophy and goals; teaching methods and techniques in character/value education; the crisis of values and education in modern and multicultural societies; value education in the human-cultural development process; Examples of values education from the history of Turkish education and culture, values education practices and research in Turkey; teacher as a role model in character and value education.

RPD 208 NON-TEST TECHNIQUES (1233)

The development and implementation of non-test self-explanatory techniques such as interviews, questionnaires, information collection slips, ticking lists, timeline, autobiography, as well as observation, rating scale, sociometry, observational techniques such as case study, case recording, validity and reliability. related work.

YEAR III SEMESTER V

MB 301 TURKISH EDUCATION SYSTEM AND SCHOOL MANAGEMENT (2033)

Formation of educational systems and structure of the Turkish education system; basic laws regulating the Turkish education system; central, provincial and foreign organization of the Ministry of National Education; teaching levels in the Turkish education system; human power, physical, technological and financial resources in the Turkish education system; attempts to reform and innovate in the Turkish education system; theories and processes of organization-management; school as social system and organization; management of human resources; student personal affairs; affairs related to education and teaching; affairs related to school management; relationships of school, environment, society and family; the Turkish education system and current debates and trends about school.

MB 303 TESTING AND EVALUATION IN EDUCATION (2033)

The place and importance of testing and evaluation in education; basic concepts about testing and evaluation; psychometric features of measurement instruments (validity, reliability, usability); developing and administering achievement tests; interpretation of test results and giving feedback; analysis of test and item scores; evaluation and grading.

Basic concepts and principles related to psychological tests, individual and group intelligence tests, achievement, ability and personality tests, interest inventories, application and evaluation of some tests and inventories.

RPD 305 PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING PRINCIPLES AND TECHNIQUES (2033)

Understanding the process and stages of psychological counseling, therapeutic conditions in the counseling process, the importance and function of basic and advanced counseling skills, creating therapeutic conditions and establishing a counseling relationship; using basic psychological counseling skills, sample applications related to the topics covered.

RPD 307 PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING THEORIES (2022)

Mainstream psychological counseling theories, the concepts, principles and techniques that form the basis of these theories; Having knowledge about evaluating and conceptualizing client problems within the framework of mainstream counseling theories and sample applications.

RPD 309 VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE (2022)

Basic concepts and principles related to vocational guidance and career counseling; Psychological factors affecting the career development process, other factors affecting the career development process, psychodynamic and developmental approaches in career counseling, Vocational Guidance and Career Counseling in Turkey.

YEAR III SEMESTER VI

MB 302 MORALITY AND ETHICS IN EDUCATION (2033)

Basic concepts and theories about morality and ethics; ethical principle, ethical rule, work and professional ethics; teaching profession with social, cultural, moral and ethical aspects; education and right to learn, ethical principles in the process of learning and evaluation; ethical principles in relations with education stakeholders (employers/managers, colleagues, parents, professional organizations and society); education/school managers, parents' and students' moral/ethical responsibilities; unethical behaviors in work and professional life; public administration in Turkey, ethical regulations about education and teachers; unethical behaviors in school and education, ethical dilemmas, problems and solutions; moral/ethical education in school and ethical boards; school principal and teacher as a moral/ethical leader.

MB 304 CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT (2033)

Basic concepts about classroom management; physical, social and psychological dimensions of the class; classroom rules and discipline in the classroom; models about classroom discipline and management; management of student behaviors in the classroom, the process of communication and interaction in the classroom; student motivation in the classroom; time management in the classroom; teacher as a teaching leader in the classroom; management of teacher-parents talks; creating a positive classroom and learning climate; sample events about classroom management by school grades.

The knowledge and skills required in the counseling process, evaluating and conceptualizing the client's problems, setting goals, using advanced counseling skills, determining a strategy and choosing an intervention, terminating and monitoring, and practices related to the topics discussed.

RPD 306 PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING WITH THE GROUP (2033)

Basic concepts and principles of group counseling; group counseling process; group counseling skills and techniques, stages of the group, groups for different problems and age periods.

RPD 308 VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE PRACTICES (1222)

Application and evaluation of measurement tools used in vocational guidance and career counseling; preparing and implementing career development programs; individual and group career counseling.

RPD 310 SPIRITUAL COUNSELING (2022)

Basic concepts and principles of spiritual counseling; spirituality, morality, counseling and psychotherapy; spiritual counseling in the context of multicultural counseling, the universal values of religion and spirituality; faith, morality and identity development; religious (theological), philosophical, sociological and psychological foundations of spiritual counseling; helping relations in monotheistic and eastern religions; mourning, emotional regulation, mindfulness, well-being, altruism, forgiveness, resilience, authenticity in the context of spiritual counseling; spiritual measurement etc. concepts; ethics in spiritual counseling.

Basic concepts about special teaching; principles and historical development of special education; legal regulations about special education; diagnosis and evaluation in special

education; individualization of instruction; inclusion and support special education services; family involvement in education and cooperation with family; characteristics of different disability and ability groups; educational approaches and teaching strategies for different groups; effective strategies in classroom management and management of behaviors.

Curriculum development in education, basic concepts, models; its relationship to school RPD programs, the history of school RPD programs and school RPD program models, planning school RPD programs, designing school RPD programs and program activities (services); implementation and evaluation of school RPD programs; development and implementation of psycho-educational programs.

RPD 409 INDIVIDUAL PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING I (1233)

Counseling with individuals by using counseling skills and techniques under supervision.

RPD 402 RPD PRACTICES IN SCHOOLS I (261010)

Examination of educational, vocational and personal/social RPD activities in preschool, primary, secondary and high schools, application and interpretation of test and non-test techniques; developing and implementing group guidance programs on various subjects.

RPD 404 CHILD LAW (2033)

The concept of protection of the child, the subject and characteristics of child law, the concept of children's rights, the historical development of children's rights in world law, children's rights in international agreements, the basic principles of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, the child and its legal situation in the Turkish Legal System, the protection of the child in public law. , private child law, social assistance and security, handling the child in

education and labor law, the duties of psychological counselors to protect children's rights, the roles and functions of psychological counselors regarding children whose legal process is ongoing.

RPD 406 POST TRAUMA PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSEL (2033)

Definition, scope and types of trauma (natural disasters, man-made traumas, proxy trauma, secondary trauma etc.); reactions that can be seen in children, adolescents and adults after trauma and the factors affecting them, individual, familial and social consequences of trauma experience, possible psychological disorders caused by trauma (post-traumatic stress disorder, acute stress disorder, etc.); Approaches to prevent the negative effects of trauma in humans and intervention methods; State policies regarding trauma and legal bases to be taken into account when working with trauma victims, qualifications and competencies of a counselor who will work with traumatized people.

RPD 408 GUIDANCE AND PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING SEMINAR (2033)

Students prepare and present comprehensive projects on the subjects they choose from the field of RPD according to their interests and needs.

RPD 410 INDIVIDUAL PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING II (1233)

Counseling with the individual using counseling skills, techniques and interventions within the framework of a certain counseling approach/model under supervision.

Domestic and foreign information systems and computer-based career counseling programs that offer services over the Internet; Developing knowledge and skills on the evaluation of these systems, the standards that systems should have, and the use of systems within the framework of ethical standards.

RPD 028 LABOR SOCIOLOGY

Concepts of work and sociology of work, history of labor relations, industrial work and organizations, division of labor and theories, work groups and social structure of work, business relations in the industrial work environment, information societies and their basic features, current problem areas of work life, new forms of work.

RPD 029 CAREER COUNSELING WITH DISADVANTAGED GROUPS

Gaining knowledge, skills and attitudes about preparing and implementing individual and group career intervention programs for disadvantaged groups, minorities and groups with different characteristics (for example, immigrants, disabled, convicts, retirees, etc.).

RPD 030 INDUSTRY AND ORGANIZATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

Examining the behavior of individuals in the working environment in order to produce scientific-based solutions to the problems related to the field of work and organization; social and psychological processes necessary for the improvement and development of the workplace; Examination and evaluation of the behavior of employees with quantitative methods.

RPD 031 INDUSTRIAL GUIDANCE AND PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING

Relationship of working life with socio-economic and political systems; industrial psychology and its field of study; Group and group behaviors, communication patterns between the workers and the workers in the enterprises, the problems of motivation, productivity, industrial democracy and participation in the management and their examination with scientific methods.

RPD 032 HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

The evolution of the concept of human resources, the three basic resources of organizations and their relationship; personnel selection, leadership, team building and management, innovation management, human resources management, managerial economics, communication techniques and development, crisis management, budgeting and money management, digital marketing and social media management.

RPD 033 JOB ANALYSIS AND PERFORMANCE EVALUATION

Job, occupation and career definition, job analysis techniques, performance evaluation, the importance of business management and job analysis, analysis of the basic characteristics of the job, job analysis for different positions, criteria used, effectiveness evaluation, productivity measurement, organizational career planning and job analysis of employees.

RPD 034 JOB AND VOCATIONAL COUNSELING

Business management, techniques used in personnel selection; career planning, career development, performance evaluation and management of the organization; Trainings that support the personal development of employees and managers (time management, effective communication, conflict resolution, sensitivity training, leadership training, etc.).

RPD 035 CAREER INFORMATION SOURCES

Career planning process, career counselors' responsibilities in the process, information use methods by those who make career decisions and criteria that can be used to evaluate the quality of information, labor market, basic information resources of the public and private sectors, and major occupational classification systems.

RPD-036 INTERVIEW SKILLS IN CAREER COUNSELING

Interview techniques, rules to be followed in personnel selection; organizational career planning; job descriptions, interview techniques and the rules to be followed in the interview.

RPD 037 LIFE CAREER DEVELOPMENT IN SCHOOLS

Planning and implementing RPD intervention programs that will support students' preparation for life events, living spaces and roles that they may encounter in accordance with their developmental characteristics and duties; planning and implementing career interviews, preparing group programs.

RPD 038 LIFETIME CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Considering career development as a dynamic process based on the continuous and unpredictable change of the individual and work life; approach and assistance services for lifelong career development; Strategies that can be applied in educational and industrial institutions
